

Fishing Regulations for Little Maggie

Our lakes produces trophy quality fish through stocking and natural reproduction. This lake has been protected and nurtured by a single family for decades. Catch and release fishing is encouraged. Only authorized boats and people may utilize this resource and the following rules apply so that this resource will be available for the future:

1. In order to reduce mortality from deep hooking, live bait is prohibited except worms for "still fishing."
2. Still fishing is reserved for the novice fisherman, and is recommended to be used for panfish only.
3. Barbless hooks are encouraged for all fishing.
4. In order to prevent contamination by non-game species, the use of minnows and crayfish and other live bait is prohibited.
5. Ice fishing is permitted, however, shelters may not be left on the ice or the shore overnight and driving on the ice is prohibited.
6. The taking of fish on or near spawning beds is prohibited.
7. Only boats with an official Little Maggie Lake permit are allowed on the lake. Boats used on Little Maggie Lake must be dedicated for use only on Little Maggie Lake. No gasoline motors are allowed. Electric motors are permitted.
8. To further preserve the quality of the fishery, the following limits are established which will be enforced by the Maggie Lakes Owners Association:

Largemouth Bass: under 12 inches - release; 14 to 16 inches - four per day per parcel; 16 to 18 inches - release; over 18 inches - one fish per year per parcel.

Perch and other panfish: no size limit - 10 per day per parcel.

Walleye: minimum 17 inches - two per day per parcel.
